





IN THE BEGINNING

BEFORE UNIVERSAL FAFSA®



IN THE BEGINNING

- Prior to the FAFSA® policy in 2015, LOFSA, through the Board of Regents, already required the FAFSA® for meritbased and need-based aid in the state of Louisiana.
 - No state application.
- Louisiana students were already accustomed to completing the FAFSA® because it was the means to access state aid. Namely the state's signature scholarship program, TOPS.





COLLEGE GOAL SUNDAY

- College Goal Sunday (CGS) was a national program designed to help students complete the FAFSA®.
- Financial aid professionals from LOSFA and Louisiana colleges and universities were available to provide free line-by-line assistance.
- CGS Louisiana was sponsored by the Louisiana Association of Financial Aid Administrators (LASFAA) and the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) with assistance from the Louisiana GEAR UP and TRIO programs.
- A grant from the Lumina Foundation funded CGS. Later, funding came from the College Access Challenge Grant and a grant from USA Funds.





COLLEGE GOAL SUNDAY

- College Goal Sunday was open to anyone, from soon-to-be high school graduates to returning nontraditional students planning to attend a two or four-year postsecondary institution.
- As an added bonus for participants, \$4,800.00 in education scholarship funds were donated to further aid in the funding of a student's education.





FAFSA® COMPLETION CHALLENGE GRANT

- In 2016, The Kresge Foundation announced a \$1.6 million grant to the National College Access Network (NCAN) to launch the 2016-17 FAFSA® Completion Challenge Grant Initiative, which would award grants of up to \$55,000 to certain U.S. cities to support their efforts to raise FAFSA® completion rates.
 - The challenge was open to 118 cities.
- NCAN accepted proposals that focused on how those cities would work across sectors to improve FAFSA® completion rates by at least 5 percent for the high school class of 2017.







FAFSA® COMPLETION CHALLENGE GRANT

- Knowing the FAFSA® policy would soon take effect, LOSFA joined forces with the East Baton Rouge Parish School System, the Louisiana Education Loan Authority (LELA), Career Compass of Louisiana, and the Department of Education to apply for the grant.
- LOSFA was one of the 22 cities to be awarded the FAFSA®
 Challenge Grant 11 East Baton Rouge public schools participated in the challenge, which targeted over 2,000 students.
- The grant allowed us to look at best practices for FAFSA® Completion and look at ways to expand those practices statewide moving forward.

LOSFA Receives FAFSA Completion Challenge Grant

BATON ROUGE – The Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) has received a \$54,000.00 Grant from the National College Access Network (NCAN) and The Kresge Foundation to increase completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by high school students in East Baton Rouge Parish public schools during the 2016-17 academic year.

College Access organizations in 118 cities across America were invited to submit grant applications. Only 22 cities were awarded nationwide.

The grant challenges awarded cities to increase FAFSA completion rates by a minimum of 5 percent for the high school graduating class of 2017. FAFSA is the primary application required for most student financial assistance programs including Federal Pell Grants, Federal on-campus Work Study programs, and low interest Federal Student Loans. FAFSA is also the primary application for the Louisiana TOPS (Taylor Opportunity Program for Students) program and the Louisiana Go Grant.

LOSFA has long been a proponent of FAFSA completion by all graduating high school seniors, having partnered with the Louisiana Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (LASFAA) to sponsor College Goal Sunday FAFSA completion events for the past nine years. LOSFA representatives also routinely assist students and parents one-on-one with FAFSA completion in their respective high schools, as well as providing assistance via LOSFA's customer service hotline (800-259-5626) and with Email help at <u>custserv@la.gov</u>.

"LOSFA is dedicated to ensuring equity of access. This involves informing all students of the opportunities available and actively assisting students with all facets of the college application and access process. The FAFSA is one of the most important college access opportunities available to students and families since completion of this one form allows students access to both federal and state aid based upon need as well as merit, said LOSFA Executive Director Dr. Sujuan Boutté. "This grant presents a tremendous opportunity for multiple entities to work together towards the goal of helping our students maximize gift aid and minimize loan debt." Boutté added.


Partnering with LOSFA in the Baton Rouge FAFSA Completion Challenge are the Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE), The East Baton Rouge Parish School System, the Louisiana Education Loan Authority (LELA), and Career Compass of Louisiana.

"This grant will invigorate Louisiana's efforts to help our students transition to a college education and be better prepared to compete for high-wage jobs," said State Superintendent of Education John White. "We need to make sure we do everything possible to help our kids use that money to achieve all of their dreams."



BEST PRACTICES

- LOSFA implemented several creative and innovative initiatives to encourage students and parents to complete the FAFSA®.
- Through these initiatives, the FAFSA® completion rate of Baton Rouge increased by 5% over the 2015 baseline data, and these initiatives became the groundwork for LOSFA's best practices for FAFSA® completion in the state of Louisiana.
- LOSFA has six best practices that contribute to Louisiana's rise in FAFSA® completion rates.





FAFSA® COMPLETION WORKSHOPS

- FAFSA® Completion Workshops: LOSFA partners with Louisiana high schools statewide to host FAFSA® completion workshops.
- LOSFA staff and postsecondary partners visit Louisiana high schools to assist students with FAFSA® completion during the school day.
- LOSFA also assisted parents with completing the FAFSA® during evening or weekend events.



- LOSFA hosted several community events that were successful for FAFSA® completion.
 - The FAFSA® Block Party was a fun and creative event that was hosted during the summer to assist students and parents with last-minute completion or correction of the FAFSA®.
 - Hosted as a partnership between LOSFA and the East Baton Rouge Parish Library System, students and parents were invited to complete the FAFSA® and enjoy refreshments at a local library in Baton Rouge.


- LOSFA developed the Compete to Complete competition as a friendly FAFSA® completion competition among the 11 public high schools in Baton Rouge.
- Schools were judged on creativity, the highest monthly FAFSA® completion, most improvement, and overall completion rate.
- The winning schools were then awarded pizza parties for the senior classes to enjoy.



FAFSA® AMBASSADORS PROGRAM

- LOSFA developed the FAFSA® Ambassadors Program, a near peer program that allowed high school students to serve as peer leaders in assisting their fellow classmates with completing the FAFSA®.
- Students were encouraged to complete the FAFSA® by the ambassadors who were more relatable and familiar with them.





FAFSA® LAB

- The FAFSA® Lab is located in LOSFA's office and is essentially a computer lab set up to assist students and parents with FAFSA® completion.
- To access the lab, students and parents register online for a time to receive convenient and private FAFSA® completion assistance.





FAFSA® FRIDAYS

- FAFSA® Fridays were held every Friday in October where parents of students in East Baton Rouge Parish and surrounding areas had the opportunity to complete the parent portion of the FAFSA®, including obtaining their FSA ID.
- The sessions were held every Friday in October from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Louisiana Dept. of Education.
- Other locations for FAFSA® Fridays included local libraries and churches.

FINANCIAL AID WORKING GROUP



To provide even greater access to financial aid for Louisiana students in 2014, the Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE) formed the Financial Aid Working Group (FAWG) to evaluate the state's financial aid application completion rates, identify deficiencies and solutions for communities with low completion rates, and provide a comprehensive list of recommendations to the LDOE on how to improve financial aid completion rates statewide.



The Financial Aid working group meets quarterly to analyze current trends and best practices in financial aid planning and create a network of resources for students around the state.



FAWG TASKS

Develop a state action plan to track school-level financial aid form completion and make recommendations to the Department regarding changes in policy or funding opportunities deemed necessary to ensure that the new policy is implemented with fidelity;

Support the Department in the ongoing identification of services and programs available for schools and families; and

Assist in the development of partnerships and alliances with financial aid-related support programs, services, and stakeholders.



THE POLICY

- In December 2015, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) approved a policy regarding postsecondary planning for graduating public high school seniors.
 The policy sought to increase student access to state and federal financial aid by requiring graduating seniors to either:
 - complete the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) application or the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®);
 - declare a hardship by waiver; or
 - submit a parental or student-of-age waiver to the local school system.





THE POLICY



- These policies were made effective with the start of the 2017-2018 school year and applied to the graduating Class of 2018.
- The data is collected in LDOE's Student Transcript System (STS).




THE STATE OF FINANCIAL AID IN LOUISIANA



SCAN TO ACCESS THE REPORT

- An additional charge of the FAWG was for the LDOE to create an annual report called the State of Financial Aid in Louisiana.
 - It details FAFSA® submission rates by school system and a breakdown of data by subgroup categories.
- LDOE also hired one full-time financial aid specialist and a part-time counselor to aid schools with FAFSA® submission.










POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENT


FAFSA® NOW CAMPAIGN





Covid-19 has impacted efforts to complete the FAFSA® form nationwide. The state of Louisiana is being proactive in closing the gap to assist students and families.



As of March 5, 2021, an additional 3,179 FAFSA applications were completed for a total of 24,254 completed applications for the state of Louisiana.





Parent outreach





- Not being able to get FAFSAs completed prior to graduation.
- The spring is busy with testing.
- Students entering a parent's SSN to invite them to be contributors.
- Midyear graduates
- Resistance against providing consent.
- Delayed financial aid offers.
- Completing the FAFSA for the wrong academic year.
- Not enough time for students who may need to submit documentation once FAFSA is processed.



FAFSA® COMPLETION PROJECT

Federal initiative to encourage all high school seniors to complete the FAFSA®. To participate, school boards, charter schools, and non-public schools must enter agreements with LOSFA to ensure all data exchanged is handled securely and will be used only as intended.

- Public school boards will enter the agreement on behalf of all public schools within the district, and charter and non-public schools will enter individual agreements.
- An authorized requestor is assigned to receive the FAFSA® data for the district. The authorized requestor then provides the data to each individual high school in the district.





FAFSA® COMPLETION PROJECT

School boards/schools receive student-level data to know which students to follow up with.

- The only data that will transfer between the agency and the school boards/schools is the student's name and whether the student has completed the FAFSA®.
- These schools will still be able to receive aggregate data from the USDOE.



STUDENT VOICES

Follow the directions included with your financial aid offer and contact the financial aid office at your institution if you have any questions.





Make friends: Universal FAFSA® is a heavy lift. Partner with postsecondary institutions, college access organizations, high school counselors, and other stakeholders that can assist with FAFSA® completion events and efforts. Reach out to community-based organizations to see if there is an opportunity to provide FAFSA® completion assistance to their audiences.



Be flexible: Consider having an alternative to submitting the FAFSA® to graduate. More importantly, make sure families know their options and the consequences of not filing the FAFSA®.

Be innovative: Come up with unique and fun ways to host FAFSA® completion events.



Empower your counselors: Provide FAFSA® training, toolkits, and other materials to aid counselors with hosting FAFSA® events at their schools. Communicate any upcoming changes to the FAFSA® and connect your counselors with organizations that can assist with FAFSA® completion efforts. Having an agreement to share student-level data with your counselors will allow them to easily identify students who still need to complete the FAFSA® or make corrections.



Spread the word: Use social media and traditional media to spread the word about upcoming FAFSA® events, campaigns, and any changes to the application. Make sure your colleges and high schools have access to up-to-date information that they can provide to their students. This includes handouts, posters, and other items to help disseminate information.





Follow up: Use your state's FAFSA® data to identify schools with low FAFSA® completion rates. Reach out to offer additional FAFSA® completion assistance or connect the schools to other organizations and resources to help with completion. Identify students with incomplete FAFSAs® and send customized communications offering assistance and specific tips to move their FAFSA® from submission to completion.




Be proactive in collecting data: Implementing Universal FAFSA® is just one piece of the puzzle. Be sure you're prepared to answer questions from stakeholders that may require data on postsecondary enrollment or FAFSA® completion rates. Think about the types of inquiries you may receive to determine what types of data you need to collect for a response. What metrics will you use to measure your success? Form Your Future (https://formyourfuture.org) is a wonderful resource for viewing state-level FAFSA® data.



Celebrate your successes: Be sure to recognize the efforts of your counselors, parents, students, postsecondary institutions, and other stakeholders that are involved in your state's FAFSA® efforts. This can be a social media post, a press release, a commercial – whatever you like! You can recognize schools with the highest completion rates, schools that exceed the state average, or schools that have shown the most improvement in their completion rates.
